Thank you Christine for sharing in our worship.

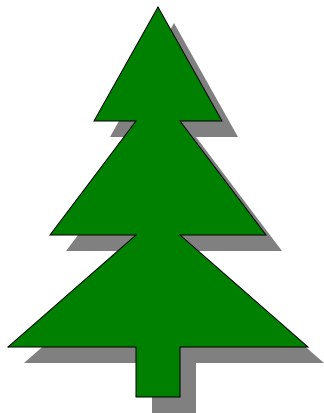

“Now Susoni is extremely happy because yesterday she sent an e-mail to mother (Ruby) and one hour later she received an answer. Because of that she couldn't sleep all night... The next morning, while still dwelling on the e-mail from you, another loving e-mail arrived from father (Dave), and reading it, with a happy heart, we cried. Because at that time Susoni and I were very worried because the rice in the hostel was all gone. “What shall we do? How can we go to the Annual Meeting? We can't go if we have no provisions.” At the very time of our need, God put us in your hearts, and you sent 7,770 rupees to us. Thank you so much, and thanks to the men and women of Joy Fellowship church. May God abundantly bless them.”
